West Cork Literary Festival

Cork County Library and Arts Service welcome West Cork Literary Festival to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of Bantry Library.

Bantry Library, built in the 1970s was constructed using the cutting-edge technologies of its era. The roof and walls are constructed of board marked, cast-in situ concrete, giving a sculptural aesthetic. The windows, single paned and recessed into the walls and the large, curved feature leaded window create a strong connection between the interior and exterior of the building.

However, 50 years on, the windows were failing but thanks to the Historical Towns Initiative Grant and Cork County Council the windows have been replaced or conserved, along with other works to make the building warmer and more efficient. We hope to continue a programme of improvements so that this building can continue as Bantry library and a WCLF partner for many more decades to come.

Promoting a love of reading is a core part of the library service and we are delighted to share stronger links than ever with West Cork Literary Festival. This year, our writer in residence is WCLF author, award winning poet Victoria Kennefick. She is supporting various writing groups throughout the county and is also delivering one to one mentorship to people who cannot attend these workshops.

Cork County Library now supports an incredible 70 book clubs across the county, including Ukrainian and Irish language book clubs. Every year we provide the latest festival titles as soon as they are published and encourage our book

clubs to visit the festival and read the festival titles. We hope that our readers find a new favourite author during their time here in Bantry and that their back catalogue of books is waiting for you, all accessible through the library.

Cork County Library and Arts Office's Rainbow Library are returning to WCLF this year. Established in 2022, The Rainbow Library is a writing and illustration group for young LGBTOIA+ people aged 14 – 23 in County Cork. Meeting monthly, it is a safe space for young people to develop their practices in all genres, with the support of writers and illustrators.

A steadfast event of WCLF in Bantry Library, the launch of the 20th edition of the annual short story anthology, 'From the Well' will be one to look forward to as we received one of the largest numbers of submissions ever.

I would like to congratulate West Cork Music and the festival's Artistic Director Eimear O'Herlihy on this wonderful programme and the commitment to diverse writers, styles and themes. Thank you also to the County Arts Office, to the sponsors, local organisations, businesses, volunteers, Bantry Library Manager, Denis Murphy and his team.

I look forward to seeing you all in Bantry this summer and invite you to visit Bantry Library to helps us celebrate this special anniversary.



Families, friendships, communities and the search for somewhere to belong are at the heart of these beautiful novels by **Caleb Azumah Nelson** and **Rónán Hession**. *Small Worlds* by Caleb Azumah Nelson is set over the course of three summers in Stephen's life, from London to Ghana and back again, this is an exhilarating and expansive novel about the worlds we build for ourselves, the worlds we live, dance and love within. **Caleb Azumah Nelson** is a British-Ghanaian writer and photographer living in South East London. His first novel, *Open Water*, won the Costa First Novel Award and Debut of the Year at the British Book Awards, and was a no.1 *Times* bestseller.

**Rónán Hession**'s *Ghost Mountain*, is a fable-like novel about a mountain that appears suddenly, and the way in which its manifestation ripples through the lives of characters in the surrounding community. It looks at the uncertain fragile sense of self we hold inside ourselves, and our human compulsion to project it into the uncertain world around us, whether we're ready or not. **Rónán Hession**'s debut novel *Leonard and Hungry Paul*, published in 2019, was an RTÉ Book of the week, has sold over 180,000 copies worldwide, was shortlisted for six literary prizes and chosen for One Dublin One Book award in 2021.





Minor Detail is the third novel by Palestinian author Adania Shibli. It was written in Arabic and published as Tafsīl Thānawī in 2017. It was translated into English by Elisabeth Jaquette and published by Fitzcarraldo in 2020. The novel revolves around a brutal crime committed during the War of 1948. Israeli soldiers rape a young Palestinian woman they find in the Negev desert, killing her and burying her in the sand. Many years later, in the near-present day, a young woman in Ramallah embarks on a journey of discovery into the events surrounding that rape and murder, becoming fascinated by it to the point of obsession when she reads about it by chance. Minor Detail is a beautiful meditation on war, violence, memory and injustice.

Anne Enright's The Wren, The Wren is a meditation on love: spiritual, romantic, darkly sexual or genetic. A generational saga, it is a testament to the glorious resilience of women in the face of promises false and true. It is an exploration of the love between mother and daughter - sometimes fierce, often painful, but always transcendent. Anne Enright is the author of eight novels, including The Gathering, which won the 2007 Man Booker Prize. In 2015 she was appointed as the first Laureate for Irish Fiction, and in 2018 she received the Irish PEN Award for Outstanding Contribution to Irish Literature.

David Nicholls' You Are Here is a love story which unfolds on a walk across the north of England; ten days through the Lakes, the Dales and the North Yorkshire Moors. It's the story of two lonely people, Michael and Marnie, both a little lost. Over many miles, as they start to talk and share stories, the possibility of a new beginning opens up before them. It is a story of first encounters, second chances and finding the way home. David Nicholls is a screenwriter and the author of six novels, including One Day which was adapted for a Netflix series earlier this year.





Maggie's collection of short stories Old Romantics was published in April 2024 and Mike's novel This Plague of Souls was published in October 2023.

Maggie Armstrong's work has appeared in the Dublin Review, The Stinging Fly, Banshee and elsewhere. She was longlisted for Short Story of the Year in the 2023 Irish Book Awards. She lives in Dublin.

Mike McCormack is an award-winning novelist and shortstory writer. In 1996 he was awarded the Rooney Prize for Irish Literature. His last novel, Solar Bones (Tramp Press, 2016), won the Goldsmiths Prize, the Bord Gáis Energy Irish Book Awards for Best Novel and for Best Book, and the Dublin International Literary Award (previously known as the IMPAC).

His first novel, Trainspotting, sold over one million copies in the UK and was adapted into an era-defining film. He has written thirteen further novels, four books of shorter fiction and numerous plays and screenplays. He lives between London, Edinburgh and Miami.

**Paul Lynch** is the prize-winning author of the novels *Prophet Song*, Beyond the Sea, Grace, The Black Snow and Red Sky in Morning. *Prophet Song* was published by Oneworld Publications in August 2023 and won the 2023 Booker Prize. In real life, Norah waited for him. In *Penelope Unbound*, **Mary Morrissy** asks – what if she hadn't? **Mary Morrissy** is the author of four novels and two collections of stories. Her short fiction has been anthologised widely and two of her novels have been nominated for the Dublin Literary Award.
