THE PLAYERS



Peter Browne [uilleann pipes / broadcaster]

Playing traditional music since the age of 6, Peter received tuition from three of the great players of modern times; Séamus Ennis, Leo Rowsome and Willie Clancy. He was twice winner of the Oireachtas uilleann piping competition and played with Raftery, 1691 and The Bothy Band. He made two albums with Philip King and played on performances of *The Brendan Voyage* by Shaun Davey. His most recent recording is with the group The Lark on the Strand. Peter was a RTÉ Radio broadcaster for over 40 years specialising in traditional music in programmes such as *The Long Note*, *Áirneán* and *The Rolling Wave*.

Carlos Sweeney McCartin Trio

Dylan Carlos [fiddle], Cein Sweeney [flute], John McCartin [quitar]

This fiddle, flute and guitar trio is uncompromising in its direct reflection of traditional Irish music as played in sessions in the north west of Ireland today. Heavily influenced by the likes of Matt Molloy, Cathal Hayden, Planxty, The Bothy Band, Dervish and Lúnasa, they are energetic and rambunctious, unbridled and unapologetic. Their debut eponymous album was an instant hit with critics and music lovers alike. Even before its official release, their second album, *The One After It*, became the best-selling Traditional / Folk album worldwide on Bandcamp.

Brian Conway [fiddle]

Brian Conway is one of the premier Irish fiddle players living in America. He performs with a skill, grace and force that are steeped in the Sligo tradition but distinctively his own. Brian has won numerous fiddling competitions, including the prestigious All-Ireland senior championship. Brian studied with the legendary Martin Wynne and also learned much of his playing from Andy McGann, who was a student of Michael Coleman. In 2025 Brian collaborated with Brendan Dolan on his third solo album *Wallace Avenue*.

Nada Ní Chuirrín [sean-nós dancer]

Nada is a sean-nós dancer, Irish traditional musician and PhD candidate on the Modern-Irish (Artistic Research) programme at Maynooth University, where she also lectured 2023-2024. In 2018 she won Corn TG4, the senior sean-nós dancing competition at Oireachtas na Samhna. Alongside this, Nada has won All-Ireland titles for both Irish traditional music and sean-nós dancing. She was awarded a John and Pat Hume scholarship for her doctoral research entitled 'Brí, Taibhléiriú agus Ceist na hInscne i dTraidisiún an Damhsa ar an Sean-nós i gConamara'/ 'Gender, Performance and Meaning in the Sean-nós Dancing Tradition of Connemara'.

Eimear Coughlan [harp, fiddle]

From Tulla in Co. Clare, Eimear continues the musical heritage of her grandfather Paddy Canny. As a multi-instrumentalist she has performed on several tours throughout Europe with the Irish Harp Orchestra. Eimear has accumulated many All Ireland titles at Fleadh Cheoil na hÉireann and has performed and taught at festivals throughout Ireland and abroad. While also a fiddle player, Eimear learned her music from her grandfather and in more recent times, she has been performing with the highly acclaimed Tulla Céilí Band. Eimear's harp playing can be heard on the album *Úrnua* with Carl Hession and Francis Cunningham

Francis Cunningham [concertina]

A native of Crusheen, Co. Clare, Francis is recognised as one of the finest young exponents of the concertina, with a deep dedication to the Clare musical tradition. In 2019, he collaborated with Carl Hession and Eimear Coughlan to release the album Umua, featuring 40 original compositions by Carl Hession. A multi All-Ireland concertina champion and sought-after tutor, Francis has performed extensively across Europe and the United States. He has also taught at festivals and workshops, including Scoil Samhraidh Willie Clancy, Consairtín, The Feakle Festival, Scoil Éigse, Meitheal and many others.



Brian Donnellan [concertina, bouzouki]

Brian's deep connection to and understanding of the music from his native East Clare is evident in his empathetic and flowing style of concertina playing. He adopts a very simple but rhythmic style when playing the bouzouki, allowing space for the melody to flourish. He has performed at various venues and festivals including The National Concert Hall, Irish Arts Center New York, Kilkenny Arts Festival, Auckland Arts Festival, Celtic Connections and The Edinburgh and Belfast International Arts Festivals. A member of the quintet, Martin Hayes & The Common Ground Ensemble, Brian also plays with the renowned Tulla Céilí Band.

Brendan Dolan [piano]

Brendan is the son of legendary pianist Felix Dolan and set dancer Joan Dolan. He grew up in Goldens Bridge, NY. Over the years, Brendan has recorded with Patrick Ourceau; Patty Furlong; Brian Conway; Mick Moloney and The Green Fields of America; and the Pride of New York, of which he is a member. Brendan has taught at the Augusta Heritage Center in Elkins West Virginia, and teaches at the Irish Arts Week in East Durham, New York. He is currently Music Director at Avenues: The World School in Manhattan, while continuing to play and teach Irish music.

Kate Ellis [cello]

Kate Ellis is artistic director of Crash Ensemble, a member of Martin Hayes' Common Ground Ensemble and has collaborated, performed and recorded with a diverse range of musicians including Bono and the Edge, Philip Glass Ensemble, Bobby McFerrin, Rhiannon Giddens, Lisa O'Neil, Glenn Hansard, The Vernon Spring and Ye Vagabonds. Recent projects include the Irish premiere of Philip Glass' *Cello Concerto Naqoyqatsi*, orchestral arrangements for Martin Hayes and the National Symphony Orchestra, the release of a major new work for solo cello by composer Ed Bennett and the creation of new music in collaboration with Sam Beste — The Vernon Spring.

Dave Flynn [composer, quitar]

Dave Flynn is an award-winning musician from Dublin. His imaginative compositions transcend traditions and borders. He redefined orchestral music by creating the Irish Memory Orchestra and he was the first Composer-in-Residence at Ireland's state guest-house Farmleigh. In his multifaceted career he has worked with Martin Hayes, Dennis Cahill, Paddy Glackin, Tommy Peoples, Máirtín O'Connor and more; as well as classical ensembles including the RTÉ Concert Orchestra, Crash Ensemble, Irish Chamber Orchestra and New Juilliard Ensemble. He has performed globally from London to Japan, New Tealand to South Korea.

Des Geraghty [flute]

From Dublin's Liberties, Des sings and plays the concert flute and has produced and directed many musical events. He has written three books, a memoir of his friend Luke Kelly, an anti-racism book *Forty Shades of Green* and more recently, *We Dare to Dream of an Island of Equals*. He was a full-time trade union representative for 35 years in the ITGWU and then SIPTU, where he was elected General President. He also had a spell as a Member of the European Parliament (1992-94) and served on many boards including those of RTÉ and TG4.

Martin Hayes [fiddle]

One of the most influential musicians in the world of Irish traditional music today, Martin Hayes remains grounded in the music he grew up with in East County Clare. He toured and recorded with the late great guitarist Dennis Cahill for over twenty years, and has collaborated with extraordinary musicians in the classical, folk and contemporary music worlds. Martin has been recognized as Musician of the Year (Gradam Ceol) from TG4, Person of the Year by the American Irish Historical Society in New York City and is recipient of the annual Spirit of Ireland award from the Irish Arts Center NY. He founded the seminal Irish American band, The Gloaming and more recently The Martin Hayes Ouartet and The Common Ground Ensemble.













Inni-K [sean-nos singer, fiddle]

Dublin-based singer, multi-instrumentalist and songwriter, Inni-K (Eithne Ní Chatháin)'s music draws on her extensive background in folk and traditional Irish music. Her original songwriting career (*The Hare & the Line* and *The King has Two Horse's Ears*), combines ethereal vocals with deft musicianship and evocative lyrics. Inni-K's third studio album, *Inion*, is a contemporary sean-nós album. Inni-K has toured the world, performing at Irish Arts Center, New York; Centre Culturel Irlandais, Paris; Symphony Hall Birmingham; and National Concert Hall, Dublin. Autumn 2025 will see the release of her 4th studio album. Eithne is the current UCC Traditional Artist in Residence for 2025.

Nuala Kennedy [singer, flute]

Nuala Kennedy is an award-winning singer, flute player, composer, and producer. Touring widely in Europe and North America, Nuala is currently singing with Irish-American supergroup Solas. *Hydra* her latest release with Eamon O' Leary was featured as 'Album of the Month' in *The Guardian*. Kennedy's roots are in Irish music and she has toured and recorded with diverse artists including Will Oldham, Norman Blake and Janis Ian. Now living in Ennis, County Clare, Kennedy is noted for her songs and a unique Irish flute style, formed in Dundalk and honed in her long time home in Scotland.

Aoibhe Kettle [harp]

Aoibhe is an accomplished harpist and fiddle player with many All-Ireland accolades to her name. Her musical passion lies in composing for harp and she is inspired by older traditional Irish music composers as well as newer composers such as Bill Whelan and Michael O'Sullivan. She recently completed her composition, *The Famine Suite* for harp. Her upcoming EP will be released later in 2025. Aoibhe comes from a very musical family and performs regularly with her brother Naoise (fiddle) and her sister Nell (harp).

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Lucia & Maria

Lucia Mac Partlin [fiddle], Maria Ryan [fiddle]

Lucia Mac Partlin and Maria Ryan met while studying in Cork and quickly realised their shared passion for folk music. While they both have been studying Classical Music on the violin from an early age, the pair have also been deeply immersed in the world of Traditional Irish Music, among other genres. The duo completed their Masters' at the University of Gothenburg in Sweden before returning home to record their debut album *Live at the Chapel* in 2018. Since then Lucia and Maria have toured worldwide, both as a duo and with their contemporary Irish ensemble Strung.

Maria O'Connor [cello]

Maria O'Connor holds a BMus and MA in Performance from the Cork School of Music (CSM). She has performed as a soloist with the CSM Symphony Orchestra and received the CSM Director's Prize. An avid chamber musician, Maria regularly tours with the Vanbrugh Quartet and with the contemporary ensemble Strung, performing in France, Turkey, Germany and Sweden. She is principal cellist with the Irish Memory Orchestra and performs with the RTÉ Concert Orchestra and Cork Opera House Orchestra. Maria is currently an Assistant Lecturer in Musicianship at the MTU Cork School of Music.

Colm O'Donnell [singer, tin whistle]

From Monalea in County Sligo, Colm plays a wide variety of instruments including flute, whistle and fiddle. He has been described as one of the greatest traditional singers of our time. He holds a record number of all-Ireland titles and has released several successful albums, including *Heart Strings*, *The Rocks of Bawn* and *Farewell to Evening Dances*. He has toured worldwide and is a founding member of the lively Irish traditional band 'The Border Collies'.







Siobhán O'Donnell [singer, guitar]

Siobhán O'Donnell is a singer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist. She started learning music from the age of nine and was greatly influenced by the local South Sligo style of traditional music and song, learning tunes on the whistle and fiddle from her father Colm. Siobhán is highly regarded as a performer and a recording artist on the Traditional Irish music scene. She has been part of bands including The Border Collies which recorded an album *Unleashed* and formed Cruniniu with some of Ireland's leading young musicians. She released her first solo album *A Beautiful Affair* in 2016.

Eamon O'Leary [singer, guitar]

Eamon O'Leary, from Dublin, is a long time resident of New York City. A singer and string player, with deep roots in the world of Irish trad, he is one half of The Murphy Beds with Jefferson Hamer. Their debut album was described by *The Hufffington Post* as one that 'bears repeated listening from start to finish, with ten beautiful, crystalline songs'. He is also a member of The Alt with Nuala Kennedy and John Doyle. His songwriting can be heard, most recently, on *The Silver Sun* from Reveal Records.

Caoimhín Ó Raghallaigh [fiddle, viola]

Caoimhín Ó Raghallaigh makes music on a 10-string fiddle called the hardanger d'amore. He has performed on some of the world's most beautiful stages, including the Sydney Opera House, the Royal Albert Hall and Carnegie Hall. He has made eighteen recordings and explores the region where traditional music begins to disintegrate. Caoimhín performs as a solo artist, yet is also widely known through his collaborative work, including groups The Gloaming and This is How we Fly, and duos with Dan Trueman, Thomas Bartlett, Garth Knox, Mick O'Brien and Brendan Begley. He has made music for theatre and film, including music for the Oscar-nominated movie *Brooklyn*.

Pádraig Ó Tuama [poet]

Pádraig Ó Tuama was born in Cork in 1975. Kitchen Hymns and 44 Poems on Being with Each Other, his ninth and tenth books, were published in early 2025. A poet and theologian, he spent 20 years working in conflict and reconciliation projects in Belfast. Since 2020 he has presented the podcast Poetry Unbound which has amassed almost twenty million downloads.

Niamh Varian Barry [viola, singer]

A musician and composer from Cork city, Niamh's powerful vocals have been praised worldwide and she is a trained viola and fiddle player, holding a Masters in Music Performance from the Royal Irish Academy of Music. She is a founding member and leader of Dave Flynn's Irish Memory Orchestra and the Kerry Scotia Ensemble. She is former lead singer of American supergroup Solas and has performed with and alongside Rhiannon Giddens, Béla Fleck, Martin Hayes, Máirtín O'Connor, Dick Gaughan, Lúnasa, Altan, Josh Ritter, Katherine Jenkins and more. Her critically-acclaimed debut solo album, *Wings* showcases her intimate vocals and cinematic orchestral arrangements.

Jane Walls [uilleann pipes]

From Moneyglass in County Antrim, Jane began playing the uilleann pipes at the age of 8. She is a six time All Ireland solo champion and was part of Spleodar, a group of young musicians who won the Siansa Gael Linn group competition in 2018. Jane has performed for Uachtarán na hÉireann in Áras an Uachtaráin and in Stormont as well as on TV, on stage in Vicar Street and in festivals throughout Ireland.

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
